Female: Pink tights and pink ballet shoes, any colored leotard. Hair pulled into a bun.

Male: Black dance pants or tights, white t-shirt, black ballet shoes

Levels III & Up: must have split soled ballet shoes.

Modern, Jazz, Lyrical, Contemporary, Tap

Female: Pink, black or tan tights, any colored leotard. Hair pulled back in a pony tail.

Male: Black dance pants or tights, white t-shirt.

- :: Modern: bare feet
- :: Jazz: Black Jazz shoes or Teacher's discretion
- :: Lurical and Contemporary: Tan Foot Paws
- :: Tap: Black Tap Shoes, no heels

Hip Hop & Musical Theater

Loose fitting athletic clothing, clean soled jazz sneakers or regular sneakers

Class Etiquette

- :: Uniforms must be worn. Extra clothes worn over the uniform is not allowed. On occasions when the studio is cold, dance warm-ups are permitted. Jewelry of any kind is not allowed.
- :: All students should arrive 10-minutes before class in order to prepare (dress in proper uniform, fix hair, use the bathroom and stretch). Children are not allowed in the studio until called for by the teacher.
- :: If your child is going to be late or absent to a class, please notify the studio prior to the class.
- :: Only four absences are allowed, for children wishing to participate in the end-of-year performance.
- :: No chewing gum in class.
- :: Please no talking while class is in session.
- :: Take correction willinglu.
- :: Greet, accept and befriend any new students.
- :: Remember to use the bathroom before class begins. If it is necessary to leave class, student should ask for permission and return promptly.

:: Studio doors are kept closed during class. Parents are asked to remain outside the studio for the duration.

Policies & Procedures

Inclement Weather

When Harford County Schools are closed or delayed due to inclement weather, all morning classes are cancelled, Call Harford Dance Center's direct line at 410.893.0022 or join our facebook page at www. Facebook/HarfordDanceCenter.com for all updates on afternoon classes.

Missed Classes

Classes missed due to illness can be made up the following week in that class level or the one below. No refunds will be given except in a prolonged medical circumstance with a doctor's medical certificate.

Waiting Area

Under no circumstances should children under the age of 12 be left unsupervised in the studio. They are to remain in the dance area only! We stress this for your child's safety.

Placement

Age is simply a guideline. It is important that students be placed according to their ability so that he or she may learn at their own individual rate. During the first few weeks of classes, your dancer is evaluated but he teacher and Studio Director to find his or her best fit. It is recommended that all students participate in a ballet technique class in order to gain the technical foundation for all other dance genres and enhance your child's ability to progress in dance.

Levels

HDC classes are divided into levels based on student ability, not necessarily based on age (with the exception of students under 8 years old).

Beginner Level 1: Prior movement experience is suggested, but not required

Placement of the following levels is at the Studio Director and Teacher's Discretion

Beginner Levels 2-4: Minimum of two or more years of Ballet experience required

Intermediate Levels 1-3: Minimum of 4 or more years of Ballet experience required

Advanced: Minimum of 5 or more years of Ballet experience required

Introductory classes begin at age 6. Beginner level classes begin at age 7, based on prior movement experience. (Lyrical and Contemporary require prior ballet experience.)

Pre-Pointe and Pointe are invitation only classes. Must be able to execute and perform basic ballet principles. Teacher's discretion for the safety and development of your child's body.

Parent/Faculty Conference

If a student is incorrectly placed; a conference may be requested by the instructor to discuss other options. A conference with the director as well as the teacher of the class may be requested to discuss progress or concerns.

Contracts

Contracts are yearly commitments, August-April. If your child is not going to continue in the dance program, we require a 30 day written notice from the first of the month. For example, if your child will not be attending classes in January, we must have the written notification in hand by November 30 to insure you will not be liable for tuition payment as of January. Tuition is based on our annual dance year and remains the same regardless of the holidays or closings.
